DESCRIPTION GHP - AP is a block course that combines AP World History and Pre AP English II. This course is meant to expand learner's minds by exposing them to various literature, writing, and historical events from around the world. Our focus throughout the year will be to examine those most impactful themes and key topics that run throughout history while developing the learner's reading and writing skills. Curiosity, growth mindset, and a desire to have a positive impact on our world are the three life skills that we most want to encourage in our learners.

OBJECTIVES Being skilled in high school and beyond comes down to developing a growth mindset. Growth mindset is an idea that failure is not an end but a beginning, and where success is just one step in a journey. We expect all learners in our classes to understand that with hard work and effort everyone can grow, progress, and experience successes. It's not about a grade but about learning and growth. Being prepared for the AP World History Exam at the end of the year is a primary goal when paired with the other skills that we expect from our learners. Passing this exam allows them to obtain college credit.

REQUIREMENTS This course is heavy in reading and writing. Learners will have assigned reading from the textbook, Traditions and Encounters: A Global Perspective on the Past, 5 days per week. Reading will be essential in preparing to pass the end of year AP Exam and without completing these readings learners will be unlikely to pass. They will also be required to complete additional reading as assigned. Reading literature and writing about it will also be required. At the end of the school year, learners will be required to take the AP World History exam.

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AP Readings	Learners are expected to keep pace with the reading and keep a notebook in which they take notes as they read. The notes should be in the Cornell Format. Much of the information they encounter on the AP Exam will come directly from the reading. In order to clarify their understanding, learners are able to request workshops on any topic in the reading.
